## **The First Certification of Wireless Equipment Maintenance Regulations**

**~Indigenous development of inspection and maintenance system for  
compliance with aircraft radio station standards~**

- **Peach becomes the first airline to receive this certification\***
- **This certificate is proof of Peach's maintenance and management system and high reliability**

**Osaka April 1, 2019** - Today, Peach Aviation Limited (Hereinafter: Peach, Shinichi Inoue, Representative Director & CEO) became the first airline company to receive the certification for wireless equipment maintenance regulations by the Regional Bureau of Telecommunications, Ministry of Internal Affairs and Communications.

Peach have received new wireless equipment maintenance regulations certification from Minister of Internal Affairs and Communications. Peach became the first company to which the certification applied.

By complying with this certification, Peach will test the wireless devices installed in the aircraft by itself or through vendors, and it will periodically report the test results and the like to the Ministry of Internal Affairs and Communications.

In addition, Peach used to perform the PDCA cycle based preventive maintenance, and as the periodic tests based on the Radio Act and the like, Peach used to annually conduct the bench check where the wireless device is tested after removing it from the aircraft, and the flight check where the status of communication is checked during the flight. With this certification, it would be possible to extend the test interval of these checks.

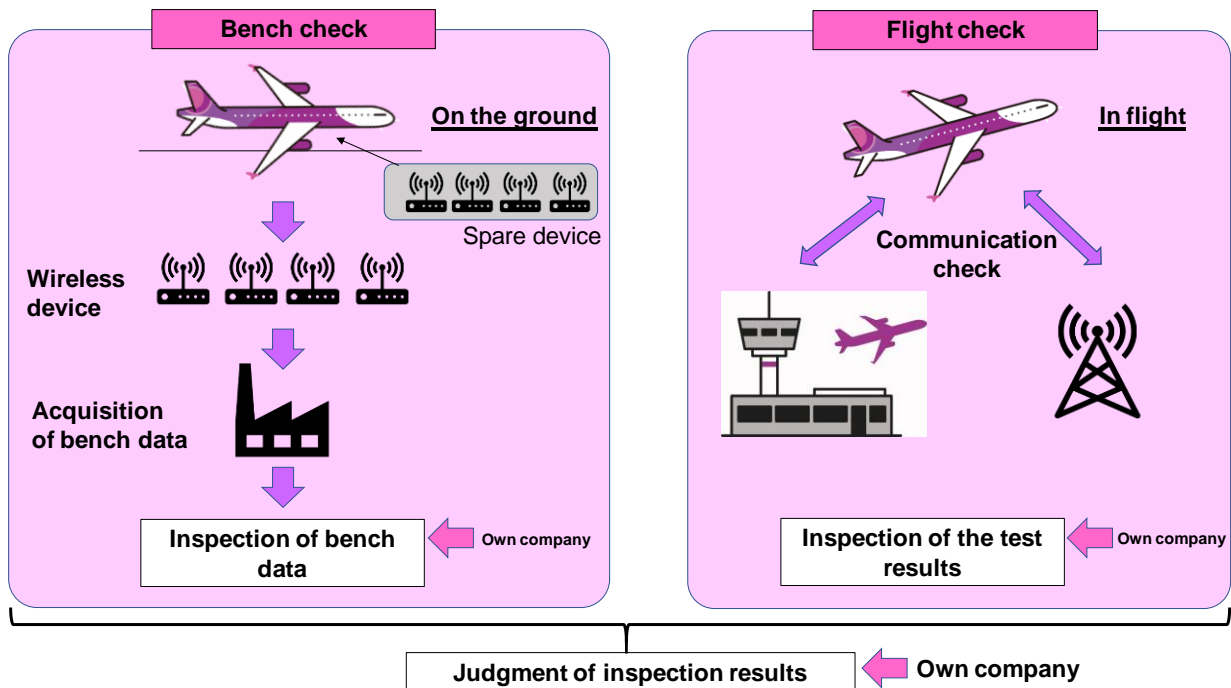
This certification proves that the government recognized the maintenance and management system, and the reliability management system of Peach. Peach will continue to strive for ensuring safe flight operations.
